Joyce continuously searches for new fabrics in different patterns and colors, and designs a different outfit for about every one hundred CAROLERS made. But variations occur even within those one hundred, because each figurine is handcrafted from head to toe, with the faces individually handmolded and painted.

So you can say that your collection is truly "one of a kind"!

BYERS' CHOICE COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

It is the hope of Bob and Joyce Byers that, in addition to turning out a quality product, they can help both their employees and their community. Thus, Bob and Joyce are involved in a great number of projects to help others, many of which are suggested by their own employees.

To oversee the distribution of donations, the Byers' Foundation was established in 1986. This organization receives a percentage of the Byers' Choice profits each year to distribute to worthy causes. These include everything from supporting local museums and scholarships, to starting programs to clean up neighborhoods and to help the homeless. When a fire devastated a nearby town this summer destroying two fire engines and the downtown business district, the Foundation quickly sent a \$10,000 check to help the community rebuild.

This service record was recognized by the Central Bucks Chamber of Commerce last spring when they bestowed the Outstanding Business Achievement Award upon Byers' Choice Ltd. New projects and ideas are always under consideration. Currently, the Foundation is a major contributor to the James A. Michener Arts Center which will centralize a sizeable art collection in Bucks County, and is also exploring the possibility of beginning a holiday fund to help the needy in the area.

At Byers' Choice, we recognize that our success would not be possible without the help of others; therefore, we will continue to help those less fortunate than ourselves as well as try to make life a little more enjoyable for others.

KAREN LENTO GAZARIAN, AVID COLLECTOR

Just two short years ago Karen Lento Gazarian, of Sudbury. Massachussetts, discovered Byers' Choice CAROLER figurines and things haven't been the same since. Karen has assembled a remarkable collection of more than one hundred CAROLERS and that number is growing steadily. She wants as complete a collection as she can get, and has examples of adults, children, grandparents, Victorian CAROLERS, and all the special-edition pieces it has been possible to track down. Of course, first editions of the Dickens' A Christmas Carol series and the children's Christmas pageant series are a notable part. Because Karen had not yet discovered the CAROLER figurines in the early years of the Dickens series, she has had to diligently search for first-edition pieces. She was able to make an even trade of her first-edition Mrs. Cratchit for another collector's first-edition Scrooge. The other collector had two copies of Scrooge, so that trading him away wasn't so painful. Now Karen buys two copies of pieces for her collection in preparation for the day when she may be able to trade one for a CAROLER figurine that she needs. Nine large display pieces that Karen has located in out of the way places round out her impressive collection.

Why does she collect Byers' Choice CAROLER figurines? Karen says, "I find them fascinating and charming, especially their faces." She has, quite simply, fallen in love with them. "While in college I made large figures similar to the CAROLERS, so I appreciate the time, work, and talent that goes into the creation of each one." Karen also expects the collection to grow in value, probably a realistic expectation since some pieces made a few years ago have fetched many times their original price. That the CAROLER figurines are made in the U.S.A. is also a plus.

What does an ardent collector like Karen do with all those singing friends? She and her husband are remodelling their house, and the plans include floor to ceiling glass shelves in the living room so that the CAROLERS can be displayed year round.

The search for pieces to add to her collection never stops: "I am *always* on the lookout," Karen emphasizes. She is always asking questions of store owners and other collectors about dates that pieces were made and clothes they wore. She keeps notes. Karen and many collectors depend on the "grapevine" to know where to find those elusive treasures. When she came across a CAROLER figurine she knew a collector friend of hers needed, Karen bought it for her. There is a real understanding among the people who love Byers' Choice CAROLER figurines.

Karen is brimming over with ideas for collectors and has been very helpful to us by sharing her thoughts with us. Her enthusiastic personality and positive passion for our product is an inspiration to us. We are proud to count Karen Gazarian as a collector of the Byers' Choice CAROLERS.

Q: The CAROLERS are a favorite in our home during the holidays. Last year our new puppy showed his appreciation of Marley's Ghost by chewing him up. Is there any way I can have him restored to his original condition?

A: We have a Repair Department who can remedy situations like yours. Serious conditions such as cracks in the face or base and torn clothing should be repaired here in our workshop. Relatively minor problems such as superficial chips in the face or base, loosened clothing or missing accessories can be easily repaired at home following our directions.

Your best bet is to contact Jan Johanson or Debbie Brink, here at Byers' Choice, preferably in writing, and describe the condition your CAROLER is in. Jan or Debbie will be able to determine the best repair method and will be glad to give you the necessary directions to heal Marley's Ghost yourself or prescribe a few days vacation here at our workshop to get him back into shape.

Q: I plan to vacation in Pennsylvania this fall and am wondering if it would be possible to stop by and tour the Byer's Choice factory.

A: As much as we enjoy meeting our collectors and showing our workshop, we feel that the distraction to our artists and workers does not have a positive effect on production of the CAROLERS. Careful planning and concentration is necessary to create our figurines and meet production demands, so unfortunately it is our policy not to offer tours.

Hopefully our regular employee introductions and other featured articles in *The Caroler Chronicle* will give you a feeling for our workshop and office environment.
